

Photography Information

Sign out a camera from the teacher.

1. Shoot all your pictures in black and white.
2. In most cases your photos will not be printed when you hand them in. If you want to make prints of your work, consider buying an inexpensive half-size photo album to use as a portfolio. You may print your photos in the classroom if you pay for ink and paper: \$1.00 per full page.
3. If you have your own digital camera, consider taking some photos (for any assignment you may be working on) at home, possibly on weekends. You will have a wider range of lighting (early morning, dusk, noon, etc) and a wider range of subject material and interesting locations.
4. Try to shoot all your pictures using natural light (no flash). If you do all your picture taking at school, this will mean standing near a doorway or window, or moving outside.
5. If you change any setting on the camera, make sure they're changed back before you return the camera.
